

Zanzibar's COVID 19

Quick Reference

Zanzibar's Worker reference

- Workers are not to report to work if they have signs or symptoms and are to report to their first aid and COVID Coordinator.
- Fill out ***the Daily monitoring app every day*** for signs and symptoms of COVID 19.
- Must have a prescreening done before entering camp/motel.
- Must provide an exit plan for leaving your contract.
- Always maintain physical distancing (2 meters/6 feet). If physical distancing cannot be maintained follow the procedures set out by the company and wear the appropriate personal protective equipment (PPE).
- Having masks that are the required 3 layers, or double up masks.
- Wearing masks while traveling in the Trucks, UTV, Helicopters and Boats.
- Wearing masks in all common areas, public areas, and when physical distancing cannot be maintained.
- Wash your hands frequently.
- Wash hands before entering trucks in the morning and before getting in the truck after work. Or minimum sanitize your hands.
- Only travel with your designated crew pods for the season.
- Know the exposure hazards and controls of the workplace.
- Follow established work procedures as directed by the employer or supervisor.
- Stay at your accommodation when not at work unless it is an emergency and /or you have permission from the COVID Coordinator.
- Report any symptoms to your first aid attendant and COVID Coordinator.
- If you develop symptoms of COVID-19 (i.e., fever, sore throat, coughing, sneezing, or difficulty breathing) while away from your accommodation, you must put on the mask or cover your nose and mouth with tissues and return immediately to your accommodation while avoiding contact with other people to the greatest extent possible, alert your COVID Coordinator and phone a health professional for advice 811.
- If in isolation, you must not leave your room unless for medical reasons.
- There will be no “inside” visits (friends or family coming into camp/motel). Any potential outside visits will be assessed on a case-by-case basis and may require isolation periods to return to work.
- When mingling with your crew keep to your pods and follow social distancing with the other pods.
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, mouth, or face. As this is the easiest path for the virus to enter your system. Avoid shaking hands or having close contact with people.
- All trucks shall be cleaned (wiped down with disinfecting cleaner) every shift (3 days) or if someone has been traveling in a vehicle is symptomatic.
- Temperature screening must be done with a properly calibrated device, with temperature thresholds based on Health Canada guidelines. Common thresholds for COVID-19 screening currently specify 37.5 degrees as an indicator of potential infection.
- To always follow the Motel and Truck Protocols.
- Must follow all Zanzibar's COVID -19 protocols and procedures, including following directions of the COVID-19 Coordinator.
- All workers have the right and duty to refuse unsafe work.
- **To remember to have fun and be there for one another.**

Zanzibar's Quick Look at Protocols THE LATEST UPDATES

Motels/Camp:

- Strict 2-week isolation of all workers arriving to contracts. (no mingling between crew pods, keep to your rooms.)
- Screened on arrival.
- No visitors allowed in motels or rooms.
- No leaving motel grounds at all unless approved by the COVID 19 Coordinator and management.
- Online food ordering and scheduled laundry.
- Daily high traffic wipe downs ie door handles, phones, switches, faucet handles, table tops (look at motel cleaning protocols)
- Once a shift deep clean
- Wear masks in all common and shared spaces, including hallways and elevators.
- No mingling in between rooms unless you are outdoors physical distancing.

Trucks:

- Everyone is to wear masks while traveling to and from work.
- Hands are to be washed before getting into vehicles and upon getting out of the vehicles. Or minimum sanitized.
- Daily high traffic wipe downs are door handles, radio, and communication devices, switches etc. (look at truck cleaning protocols)
- Once a shift deep clean.
- Have adequate ventilation in the vehicles while traveling (open windows etc.).
- No eating or Drinking in the vehicles.

ATVs:

- No sharing of helmets between workers.
- Travel in crew pods.
- Daily and once a shift cleaning
- Masks are to be worn while traveling.

Loading trees:

- Only 2 people are to load trees in the back of the first while still maintaining 2m physical distancing.
- If picking up trees from nurseries or other locations, follow applicable COVID 19 procedures for these sites. I.e., wiping down locks and handles.
